## **INITIATIVES**

The Marine Historical Society of Detroit is working on multiple initiatives that take time and financial resources. Among them:

▶ Image Scanning - Our Society has made the preservation of historical images initiative #1. Since this initiative started, we have acquired the collections of Jim Bartke, John Poole and others. In addition, Skip Meier, Jim Hoffman, John Coulter and Dick Wicklund have donated their collections to MHSD for scanning. Our dedicated board and volunteers spent hundreds of hours in 2022 scanning the images and creating a searchable database.



- ▶ Image Database What good are scanned images if they can't be accessed? MHSD's board is finalizing the structure and architecture of a searchable database that can be easily accessed by our members.
- Manuscript Collection MHSD's board is having initial discussions about creating an electronic logbook/corporate records database. The idea is to digitize the content and make it available to its members, for historical research or to help fill in family records.
- Social Media Presence Many of us scroll through Great Lakes social media posts on web apps such as Facebook. Have you taken time to consider that MHSD posts unique content and interesting photos almost daily? Social media has more flexibility than the printed newsletter, and this content continues to create member engagement. We like to think of this content as supplemental to The Historian.
